Qualifications for appointment

Candidates for Police Explorer must meet the following requirements:

- Be 14 to 18 years of age
- Maintain at least a 2.0 GPA in High School. If graduated from High School, you must carry at least 3 semester credits in higher education
- Be free from any physical or mental condition that could impair participation in the program
- Have no record of arrest
- Have no serious moving violations
- Complete and submit an application to the program coordinator
- Pass a general knowledge written examination
- Participate in an oral interview
- Pass a thorough background investigation

- Traffic Accident and Crime Scene Assistance
- Hazardous Material
- Helicopter Landing

Police Explorers participate in the Police Department with Neighborhood Watch, Quality Neighborhoods Team, assisting Communications, and Patrol Divisions. Qualified Explorers may ride along with Patrol Officers during patrol shifts. Explorers also participate in patrol shifts in teams of two.
