### *AB60 Driver License Implementation*

Beginning January 1, 2015, California residents who are unable to provide satisfactory proof of legal presence in the United States will be able to legally obtain a California driver's license. They must be able to prove their identity and prove that they reside in California.

They can prove their identity by presenting to DMV

- A California Driver's License
- A California ID Card

**Or**

A Foreign Document that is valid, approved and electronically verified by the DMV with the country of origin, such as

- Mexican Federal Electoral Card (2013 version)
- Mexican Passport (issued 2008 or later)
- Mexican Consular Card (2006-2014 versions)
- Foreign Passport + Social Security Number

In order to prove their residency, they can provide any of the below documents that list the applicant's first and last name:

Rental or lease agreement with the signature of the owner/landlord and the tenant/resident

Deeds or titles to residential real property

Mortgage bills

Home utility bills, including cell phone bills

School documents

Medical documents

Employment documents

Faith-based documents

Insurance documents, including medical, dental, vision, life, home, rental or vehicle

Internal Revenue Service or California Franchise Tax Board tax returns

California Certificates of Vehicle or Vessel Titles or Registration

California Driver's License or ID card

Change of Address Confirmations by the U.S. Postal Service (Form CNL 107)

Federal government-issued documents

Property tax bill or statement

Records of a financial institution

Court documents that list the applicant as a resident of California

A letter, on letterhead from a homeless shelter, a shelter for abused women, a nonprofit entity, a faith-based organization, an employer, or a government within the U.S. attesting that the applicant resides in California.

A parent, legal guardian, or child may use a birth certificate and a spouse or domestic partner may use a marriage license or domestic partner registration certificate to trace his or her relationship to the individual to whom one of the above residency documents has been addressed.

Applicants must satisfactorily pass a written exam, including a sign test, pass a vision test, provide a thumb print and photo, and pass a behind-the-wheel driving test, and pay fees associated with obtaining a driver's license.

Any license issued under AB60 will have a notation on its face, indicating that it is not valid federal ID. This notation will be on the top right for a driver over 21, and on the lower right area for a driver under 21.

Any holder of a driver's license issued under the provisions of AB60 will have the same rights and responsibilities as any other licensed driver in California (insurance requirements, etc).
