CDBG BASICS

What is CDBG



The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program is funded by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)



Primary objective- help develop viable urban communities through:

- Affordable Housing
- Economic Opportunities
- Suitable Living Environments



Funding Activities

Minimum 70% of funds must support activities that benefit lower income persons such as:

- AREA BENEFIT: 51% in the target area are LMI (Example: Infrastructure Improvements Such as Curb, Gutter, & Stormwater) *
- LIMITED CLIENTELE: Meet 1 of the Following Tests:
 - 1. Presumed LMI such as elderly, homeless, abused children (Example: child advocacy services);
 - 2. Info on family size and income shows at least 70% served are LMI (Example: Job Training for Disabled Adults);
 - 3. Income Eligibility Requirements which limits the activity to LMI (Example: Services for the Homeless)
 - 4. Nature/location of the activity presumes clients are LMI (daycare at PH Complex)
- HOUSING: Add/improve permanent residential housing but can be rental property (Example: Residential Rehab; Housing Construction; Acquisition of Property or Conversion of Buildings for permanent housing).



CDBG Basics

- Highly complex and restrictive
- Strict deadlines
- Eligible uses include:
 - Public services to low-income residents
 - Acquisition of real property to serve low- income residents
 - Relocation and demolition
 - Rehabilitation and improvements of public facilities



Who is and who is not Eligible?

Eligible to Apply

- Certified non-profits-501 (c)(3)
- Governmental Agencies

Not Eligible to apply

- Individuals and families
- For-profit entities





• Quarterly Reporting: service record, including race, ethnicity, income and family head of household data. Allowing households to self certify.

Your intake forms must contain the categories to ensure accurate data collection of racial/ethnic information, such as the sample below:

Grant Provisions


General liability insurance, vehicle insurance, workers comp insurance. Insurance with a single limit of \$1,000,000 each.

Davis-Bacon Act-Prevailing Wage for projects using federal funds

Minority and Women Owned Business Enterprises- Must have an opportunity to compete for and perform work included in the agreement



Estimated Funding






2- yearFundingCycle

How to Qualify

• Criteria:

- Ability of proposal to show a clear community development or housing need
- Ability of project to address the needs of low- and moderateincome residents
- Cost effectiveness of the project
- Leverage of City's CDBG funds
- Impact of funding on the outcome of the proposed project



Criteria Continued


- Capacity to operate and maintain facility/housing project
- Management and fiscal capacity of the project sponsor
- Quality and completeness of proposal and budget

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

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
